## Scientific Program Structure

The Conference is a forum for physicians and health professionals with special expertise or interest in papillomavirus infections, lower genital tract diseases, cervical cancer screening and prevention.

Advances are highlighted through the presentation of scientific research, education and training innovations, practical issues, organizational and management models. The scientific format of the congress has four directions:

- Clinical and Epidemiological Science for Gynecologists, Dermatologists and Oncologists
- Cytopathology
- Basic Science, Virology and Biology
- Public Education

Within each theme, the program committee has identified several important issues. Each topic is covered by Plenary Sessions (PS), Scientific Sessions (SS), Symposia (S), Free Communications (FC) and Poster Sessions. Precongress Scientific Events will include Training Courses (TC) and Seminars (SEM).

### Precongress training courses

In addition to the regular Conference programme, EUROGIN 2006 offers attendees interactive training courses which are designed to provide new educational strategies and skill-building learning experience for participants. gynaecologists, dermatologists, cytopathologists, oncologists and research scientists will be able to attend 4 Post-Graduate Training Courses (Update Colposcopy Course, Basic and Advanced Courses on Vulvar Diseases, Update on Cytopathology, Office Gynaecological Procedures Training Session).

Because of attendance limitations, early registration is strongly encouraged for the training courses as reservations are made on a first-come first-served basis. Registration can be made on the form included with this brochure. Reservations will only be accepted with a completed registration form and full payment.

### Seminar screening programs in developed and developing countries

The aim of the seminar is:

- to initiate dialogue and provide an opportunity for exchanging experience
- to assess the medical and economic advantages of the program
- to discuss the feasibility of rational approaches to optimising both cytological disease and quality assurance, taking into consideration the significance of the latest technology and economic necessities.
- to determine and subsequently set up the foundations of a coherent network and ways of evaluating these actions.
- To present and discuss the current developments in the field.

The seminar capacity is limited to 200 applicants. Early registration is strongly encouraged as reservations are made on a first-come first served basis. Registration for the seminars can be made on the form included with this brochure. Reservations will only be accepted with a completed registration form and full payment.

### Expert consensus conference

Organized as a plenary session, this is one of the major events of the congress.

The Expert Consensus Conference will report on the conclusions and recommendations of the EUROGIN experts' meeting devoted to the global challenges of cervical cancer prevention. This session will present the final report on the perspectives of applying the latest innovations and new prevention strategies to the field of cervical cancer prevention, including HPV vaccines.

### Plenary sessions

Plenary sessions will include lectures that provide a broad overview and timely summary of advances in various areas by both pre-eminent physicians and pioneers in the discipline that are of interest to most participants.

**Public education and women's advocacy sessions on HPV infection and related diseases** are aimed at describing current knowledge in public health issues and awareness.

### Symposia

Symposia, hosted each day in the late morning and early evening, will be focusing on recent scientific findings and future developments in the field and emphasis on these areas where the discipline is moving or changing the practice.

### Scientific sessions

The parallel scientific sessions will begin with introductory lectures by the session chairs, followed by presentations of selected abstracts for oral delivery. Presentation of new data on various topics provide broad coverage of the scientific spectrum and ensure that everyone will find topics of interest. The overall program includes 24 Scientific sessions.

### Poster presentations

Selected submitted papers will be displayed in the exhibit hall for meeting attendees to view at their leisure from 8.00 a.m. to 7.00 p.m.

### EUROGIN Grants - Jan Walboomers Award

The purpose of this grant is to promote research in the field of HPV infections as a tribute to one of the pioneers in HPV research.

### Educational material

Submission of an abstract implies the commitment that the presenting author will participate in the Eurogin 2006 congress and that financial resources to attend are available.

Each abstract must be sent together with the registration form, by e-mail or via the internet on the [www.eurogin.com/2006](http://www.eurogin.com/2006) website. Abstracts whose presenting author is not registered will not be considered for selection.

- Abstracts must be submitted in ENGLISH.
- Original scientific material is welcome.
- Abstracts are peer reviewed and ranked by experts in the category (topics) selected; they are allocated to oral or poster sessions. Authors who do not wish to be considered for oral presentation must check the box "poster". However, please note, that the Scientific Committee will make the final decision for the mode of presentation.
- The final decision of the Scientific Committee will be mailed in February 2006.
- Authors agree that their abstract will be published in an Abstract Book which will be provided to all registered participants of the congress.

Note: One person may submit more than one abstract. Selected oral presentations will be 10 minutes maximum in length.

Abstracts must be submitted online and must be received by January 15, 2006

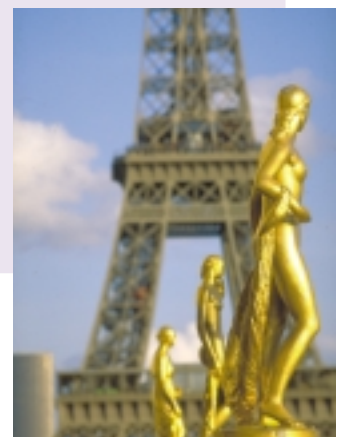
**Maximum number of characters: 2,200**

- Use Arial font size 12
- The title must be written in UPPER CASE (capitals) and bold; (keep it brief, clearly indicating the nature of the investigation. It should not exceed 2 lines).
- Abstracts should be structured in four sections, clearly mentioned: objective methods, results and conclusions.
- Authors should be listed by the surname (family name) followed by initials of the first name only (do not include full first names).
- Give professional address for all authors: name of hospital, unit or laboratory, city and country in lower case. No other indications are to be given. If different affiliations, please use numbers.
- Do not indent spaces on the first line of each paragraph. Abstracts should be typed single spaced, with no space between paragraphs. Use international standards for scientific articles.
- Only standard abbreviations may be used without definition. Data must be given in units widely used in literature.
- Only essential references should be included and put in brackets at the end of the abstract, numbers in the text may refer to them.

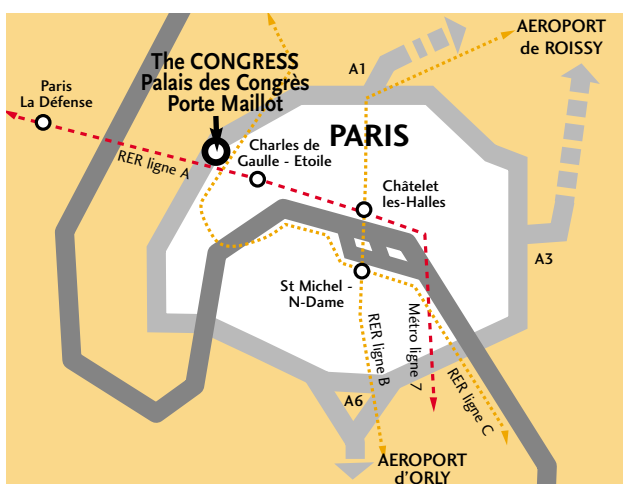
